But, the Bible does not leave us to wonder on this very important topic. You will discover that a clear understanding of the condition of man in death will reveal the truth about the character of Jesus.

THE NATURE OF MAN

Genesis 2:7- Dust of earth plus the breath of God created a living soul.
- God warned man that sin would result in death.

Genesis 3:4 - Satan lied and said that sin does not lead to death.
Genesis 3:19 - God told Adam that his sin would result in death.

Romans 6:23 - The wages of sin is death.

Genesis 5:5 - Adam died when he was 930 years old.

1 Corinthians 15:22 - Adam's fallen nature passed on sin and death to all mankind.

Romans 5:12 - Through Adam death affected the whole human race.

Romans 3:23 - All are sinners and fall short of God's glory.

James 1:15 - The end result of choosing sin is death.

Ezekiel 18:4 - Because of sin all souls die. There is no immortal soul. **Job 4:17** - Man is mortal by nature and is therefore subject to death.

1 Timothy 6:13-16 - No one but God has immortality.

THE CONDITION OF MAN IN DEATH

Ecclesiastes 9:5-6 - Every function of life ceases at the time of death.

Ecclesiastes 9:10 - Man's final resting place is the grave.
 Ecclesiastes 12:7 - At death the breath of life returns to God.
 The breath of God is in the nostrils of man.

Psalms 146:4 - Man's breath returns to God but man returns to the earth.

Psalms 6:5 - When we die our thanks to God also cease.

Psalms 115:17

- The dead don't go up into praise but down into silence.

- The patriarch David is buried and did not go to heaven.

- The dead don't praise God they go down into silence.

John 11:11-14 - Jesus taught that death is a sleep.

Job 7:9-10

- The dead cannot return to the house where they once lived.

- The dead will not be raised to life until the end of the world.

- The dead will not be raised until the change comes.

1 Occidentations 15.51 These that are reliced in Jacob will be absorbed to in-

1 Corinthians 15:51 - Those that are raised in Jesus will be changed to immortal life.

1 Thessalonians 4:13 - Those that die in Christ as described as being in a "sleep."

THE VICTORY OVER DEATH

Job 19:25, 26 - The righteous will be resurrected to see God at the last day.

Job 14:14 - The dead will not be changed until they are raised to life.

1 Thessalonians 4:16 - The dead in Christ will be resurrected at the last trumpet.

1 Thessalonians 4:17 - The living and the resurrected saints meet Jesus together.

1 Corinthians 15:20-24 - The saints come to life again at the return of Christ.

1 Corinthians 15:50 - We must be changed before we enter heaven.

Philippians 3:20-21 - Jesus will give us glorious bodies when He returns.

1 Corinthians 15:52 - We will be changed from mortal to immortal at Jesus' return.
1 Corinthians 15:55 - The first resurrection will bring complete victory over death.

John 14:1-3- We cannot go to heaven until Jesus returns to receive us.
