Lay Bible Worker/ Instructor	The Lifting Up Jesus Lay Bible Worker/Lay Bible Instructor Course is a dynamic training programme, specifically designed to support Lay People in their discipleship journey as they learn to disciple others through Bible Work. The course foundation is based on the scripture; John 12:32 "But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all men unto myself". The Course not only gives information about how to do Bible Work but gives the learner a unique experience with the word of God as it leads you into a deeper intimate relationship with Jesus as you prepare to share Him with others. During the course the learner will explore how to connect themselves with Jesus intimately and how to lead others into intimacy with Christ; at church, within the family, at work, with friends or even strangers that they meet on the street. The course places a strong emphasis on one-to-one evangelism. It will take the learner on a step-by-step journey of how to give effective Bible Studies, gain decisions for Christ, prepare someone for baptism and how to nurture a new believer into a mature disciple in Christ. Community Pathfinder	The Pathfinder club is an important brand and feature of the Adventist church because of its proven track record. Community Pathfinder Club (CPC) take this ministry to another level. We believe through the Pathfinder club we can mingle with people the way Jesus desires us to. Pathfindering is not an event but a lifestyle. This course will equip the local church Pathfinder club to go into the community and establish a 'satellite' club monitored by the church. The church club need not be dissolved to start a CPC, NO, but to give the community what we are enjoying in the church.	

Jewish Relations

This course provides an in-depth exploration of Adventist-Jewish relations, focusing on the theological, historical, and practical aspects of engagement between Adventists and the Jewish community. It examines key biblical principles, the Jewish roots of Christianity, and the role of Adventists in fostering meaningful interfaith dialogue. Participants will gain insights into historical interactions between Jews and Christians, the impact of antisemitism and replacement theology, and ways to build respectful and informed relationships with Jewish individuals and communities today.

Through lectures, discussions, and case studies, students will develop a deeper appreciation for Jewish culture, traditions, and beliefs. The course also highlights Adventist efforts in Jewish relations, equipping participants with practical tools to engage with Jewish friends and neighbours effectively. Emphasis will be placed on fostering understanding, overcoming misconceptions, and creating opportunities for interfaith dialogue that reflect Christ's love and respect for all people.

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Explain the historical and theological foundations of Adventist-Jewish relations.
- 2. Identify key Jewish beliefs, practices, and traditions, and their connections to Christianity.
- 3. Recognise and address antisemitic biases, replacement theology, and other barriers to interfaith dialogue.
- 4. Develop practical strategies for meaningful engagement with Jewish communities in an informed and respectful manner.

Make contact with the local hospital via the chaplaincy trainer/supervisor in order to try to become a volunteer chaplain (this will involve doing some NHS mandatory online training and to commit to a weekly visit of patients on a designated ward) The course program depends on completing theoretical and practical chaplaincy care work, hence the need to connect you with a local healthcare institution. The SEC will provide a training manual. A commitment to the world mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church is very important.
